Fine wine has an excellent performance track record. Over the past 25 years it has returned almost 2,000% (a 11.2% compound annual growth rate).

Our analysis shows that the majority of this performance has been achieved by the highest quality wines.

Our **Fine Wine Model Portfolios** are therefore designed with three objectives:

- Quality** The best wines from the best years, with balanced exposure to different countries and estates.
- Liquidity** Wines which can be bought (reasonable) freely on the secondary market. Our portfolios are based on the most liquid wines on fine wine trading exchanges (especially Liv-ex).
- Track Record** Wines with the strong history of investment performance.

The portfolios are designed for different levels of investor, from those just starting out up to serious investment collections:

£100,000 "Starter Portfolio" - Intended to give new investors exposure to many of the world's great investment wines. Diversification is more limited, but this portfolio is an excellent introduction to fine wine investment and covers the main bases.

£500,000 "Collector's Portfolio" – A solid spectrum of most of the world's greatest wines. The portfolio is designed to recreate the performance of the 'fine wine market'.

£1,000,000 "Investor's Portfolio" – This portfolio is designed for serious investors who wish to make a meaningful investment into fine wine.

£100,000 Starter Portfolio

Emphasis is on balanced exposure to as many famous and strong performing wines as possible.
